This has been thoroughly renovated and decorated and made suitable for the proper display of the books. New shelving to accommodate twelve hundred volumes have been erected and we have now one of the nicest library rooms in the County. Some of our own active members and a number of the officers and directors turned out on Friday, December 12, and the cases and books were transferred to the new premises. The decorating and the shelving was done by Mr. Mitchell and the thanks of the directors are due to the ladies for their splendid assistance in dusting and cleaning every book before they were placed on the shelves.

A cordial invitation is extended to the citizens and all those interested in the Library to come and visit the new book room. The Library will be open each Monday and Wednesday from 7.30 to 9 p.m. and on Saturday from 2 p.m. until 9 o'clock.

It is the intention of the collectors to make a thorough canvas of the town for new members early in the new year and it is hoped that sufficient funds will be collected to pay off our indebtedness and put the library on a sound financial basis again. A parcel of new books are on the way and will be placed on the shelves before the new year. There have been a number of deserving outside institutions asking for help from this village, but this is our own library and deserves our help, and it is an institution we should be proud of, having been established in the year 1889.
