**FOR BROADCASTING**  
 Ottawa June 5th.—Over two hundred applications for broadcasting have been submitted to the Department of Marines, which department has charge of the radio service. The great majority of these will likely be held in abeyance until after the general elections, it has been intimated by department officials. Some of the more extensive projects may be authorized but the others will have to wait.

One of the applications which may be granted very soon is one from the Canadian Pacific Railway for permission to erect three high power broadcasting stations, one in Montreal, one in Toronto and one in Western Canada, at a point to be selected later.

**WONDERFUL OPTIMISM OF WESTERN FARMERS**

The optimistic spirit of the Western farmers surely ought to stimulate the discouraged feelings of the Easterners. Prairie farmers are apparently the most optimistic people in Canada to-day. In spite of their 1929-30 marketing experience, in spite of last year's drought and consequent moisture shortage and in spite of the general slowing down of business, they are going right ahead with their preparations for a crop just as though nothing had happened. Wheat seeding was practically completed by May 17, and much of it was up. However, the normal annual increase of a million acres or two has not taken place this year, and Manitoba and Saskatchewan will probably, on the final reckoning, record a slight decrease as compared with the 1929 acreage.

If the Prairies do not fill as many bushels as usual with wheat this year it will be more on account of too little moisture than too little acreage. Broadly speaking, the 1930 crop is handicapped by a deficit of 4 inches of rainfall, which it should now have by now. It is estimated that 40 per cent of the wheat this year is sown on fall and spring ploughed land and stubbled in. Even a good normal rainfall during the growing season will scarcely render plant food available in sufficient quantities to meet the needs of a rapidly growing crop in June and July. About 50 per cent of the wheat is seeded on summer-fallow.

**43,000 RECEIVING OLD AGE PENSIONS**

The Department of Labor is paying one half of the cost of the old age pensions to 43,000 pensioners, according to a statement issued by H. H. Ward, Deputy Minister of Labor. Mr. Ward said that the old age pensions schedule is now in effect in a majority of the provinces: British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Alberta, Ontario and the North West Territories.

New Brunswick has also just passed an act and consideration is being given to the subject in other provinces.
