Wednesday, April 5th, 1911

Mr. and Mrs. Percy E. Armstrong have the sympathy of their many friends in the sorrow they are subjected to, owing to the death of their little babe, Dorothy Ellen. The little one was ushered into this world on Wednesday but only lived until Thursday morning. The funeral took place on Saturday to Kohler Cemetery.

Born,—In Hamilton, on Friday, March 31st, to Mr. and Mrs. Alex. Mercer, a daughter.

Neil Elliott shipped a mixed car of stock to Toronto Monday. He paid \$6.60 straight for hogs.

Cayuga, April 11.—J. Y. Murdock, the Jarvis lawyer, charged with forgery, embezzlement and theft, pleaded guilty to three charges to-day and was remanded until April 25th for sentence. Murdock waived examination before Magistrate T. E. Cline and was immediately taken before Judge G. B. Douglas. He elected to be tried without a jury and entered a plea of guilty.

At his own request sentence was deferred for two weeks to give Murdock a chance to make restitution. He explained that he had a library, equity in two houses, and also the proceeds of the draft purchased in Hamilton, all of which he would assign for the benefit of those whom he had wronged. Following the usual practise in criminal courts where a lot of charges might be laid, the Crown preferred but three.
