From The Record's Files for the Year 1911

Wednesday, April 26th, 1911.

Jarvis celebrates May 24th, 1911. J. A. Burwash has been appointed a director of the Erie Telephone Co. in place of J. Y. Murdock, resigned.

The Business Men's Association of Jarvis have appointed a committee for the purpose of carrying out 24th of May celebration and work throughout the year. Proceeds of same to be deposited in the Bank of Hamilton along with monies already deposited in Bank for the purpose of purchasing land for a public park for Jarvis. The Committee met last evening and appointed J. A. Campbell, President; C. S. McCarter, Vice Pres.; J. A. Burwash, Sec'y; C. G. Allen, Treas. Come people of Jarvis help them out, boost our town and let us have a park for ourselves and children.

Married—Graydon—Booth.—A quite but exceedingly pretty wedding was solemnized at "Flowing Well," the residence of Wm. and Mrs. Booth, Chespside, on Wednesday, April 19th at high noon, when their only daughter, Violet Winnifred, was united in the holy bond of matrimony to Donald H. Graydon, of Hamilton, eldest son of James and Mrs. Graydon of Jarvis. The mystic words that made these two one were pronounced by Rev. H. 


