 this week. Distance 8 miles.
 Road No. 13, Township of Moulton is under construction. Metal base of crushed gravel from lake beach. Will be completed in one week's time. Distance 7 miles.
 Road No. 17, in Townships North Cayuga and Camboro, has been under construction since May. A macadam base, a mixture of one inch stone and screening has been put down, including the connecting link in Cayuga, it will be completed this week, distance 12 1/2 miles.
 The balance of road 17, from Cayuga to the Brant County line has been receiving careful attention all season.
 Road No. 16 in Township of Seneca, from Village of York to Seneca Station is receiving a re-surface of crushed gravel and will be finished November 1st.
 The following roads still require maintenance attention:— Nos. 4, 7, 8, 9, and 11 (Rainham, South Cayuga and Dunn) and No. 12 (Township of Rainham)
 A meeting of the Wardens and Road Committee of the four counties in the Niagara Peninsula, Wentworth, Lincoln, Welland and Haldimand, will be held in the Court House Cayuga, at an early date to discuss road problems.
 It is the intention of the Committee to make a careful inspection of all roads in the County Highway System as soon as the season's work is completed. The total mileage is 265 and all roads are metalled.
