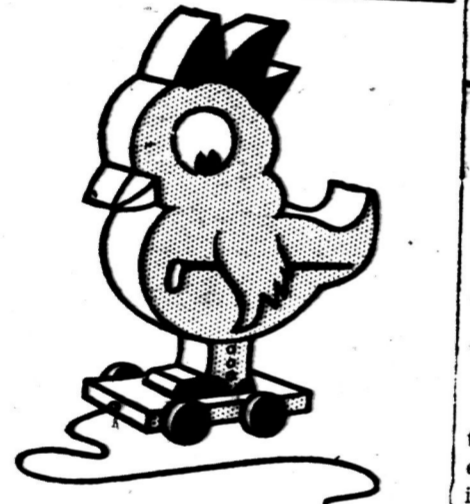

Horseshed

Horseshed enjoys great popularity as an adjunct to roast beef. Few cooks think to serve it with other dishes. Yet it is equally good with mutton and as it is an aid to digestion, its more extensive use may well be encouraged.

Again, it is very good grated and natured over fried sole or fish that has been cooked with butter and milk between plates in the oven.

A horseshed cream sauce may be bought in bottles. This is invaluable for the housewife who has not time to make her own, and it will be appreciated if it is served with grilled steak. It is also good with salmon.

A sauce that is excellent with game or saddle of mutton is made with horseshed, vinegar and cream—to be added slowly—and then beaten up with red-currant jelly. This is delicious, but rather expensive, so should be reserved for high days and holidays.

Household Hints

Clean a shiny collar by sponging it with a cloth moistened with vinegar. Stains on aluminium and tin may be removed by rubbing with salt. Put a handful of seedless raisins in your breakfast porridge. This greatly improves the flavor. The flavor of carrots and turnips will be improved if a pinch of sugar is added to them while cooking. A teaspoonful of sugar added when frying or steaming tomatoes brings out their full flavor. Mildew on leather can be removed by rubbing first with vaseline and then with a soft cloth. To prevent fried eggs from sticking or breaking, add a teaspoonful of flour to the frying fat. Powdered starch rubbed over walls with a soft cloth will remove stains. Hot soda-water will remove grease from the grid of a dirty gas stove.

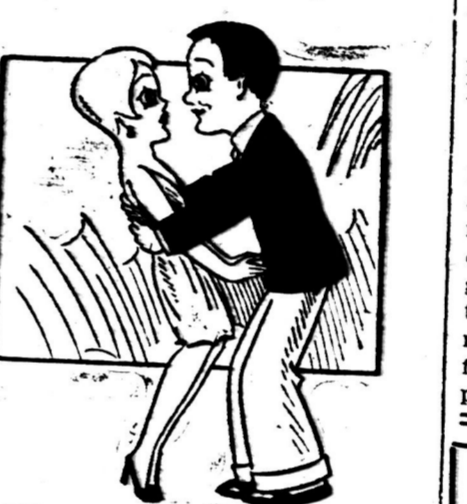

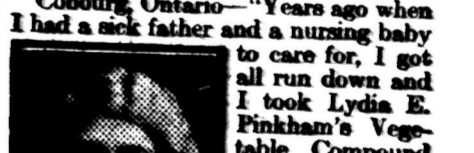
