#### > Payments by Postcard

One of the latest banking ideas is the postcard cheque. It comes from Germany, and is designed to cut down overhead expenses. A perforated strip at one end gives details of the account. This is torn off when the postcard is received, and the cheque is then presented at the bank in the usual way.

Anyone can open a posta, cheque account, but the principal advantage claimed for the system is that people who have no account can yet make payments, through the Post Office, to any postal cheque account in any part of the country. This is said to facilitate mail-order business.

Similarly, anyone can receive a payment from any postal cheque account, irrespective of whether he himself has an account or not.

#### Oil Production in Alberta

Alberta's output of oil during the month of May of this year was slightly higher than that for the corresponding period last year, according to figures compiled in the Department of the Interior from the reports of operators. The 85,463 barrels of naphtha produced came from the lime formation in the Turner valley, thirty-nine wells contributing the total. The light crude came from higher horizons in Turner valley and from the Red Coulee field. The total production of light crude was from ten wells, three of which also produced naptho. 
