Should it, by some happy chance be one of the rare old violins filled with the music of the ages, the resulting harmony is "a thing of beauty and a joy forever." He, the master musician, will bring forth some music from each and every instrument.

Even though the master violinists are exceedingly rare, we can all be true musicians and release at least

some of the music that is pent up inside of our instruments—the Brownies. There is something within each one of them just needing the necessary encouragement—happy environment and opportunity—to burst forth into a self-expression that might otherwise lie dormant for years—maybe, forever. Milk Diet Aids Hens

Among the wide variety of feeds which comprise the poultry ration of today, none compares with milk in encouraging fowls to keep hard at their egg-laying duties during the hot weather of Summer, in the opinion of Professor C. S. Platt, assistant poultry husbandman for the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment Station, who asserts that the poultryman "cannot afford to leave milk out of the ration at this season."

He explains that the appetite of laying birds, normally at its best during the Spring months, is likely to weaken with the approach of warm weather. This falling off in feed consumption, and especially of dry mash, forces the bird to curtail its egg production or lose body weight.

"Well-bred birds will continue laying even at the expense of body weight," Professor Platt states, "but birds of inferior breeding will quit laying and moult. However, this stopping of egg production can, to a large extent, be delayed until later in the season if the fowls are fed a proper amount of milk."

Berlin on Traffic

Berlin.—"We shall soon see better traffic control in Berlin than in any other metropolis," William Phelps Eno, American traffic expert, predicted recently following a three-day study of Berlin's traffic arrangements.

The German authorities, he said, were tackling the problem in a highly scientific manner and at their present rate of progress would soon be able to show the other big cities some new tricks in the art of preventing pedestrians and automobiles from colliding. "I have been especially impressed with Berlin's traffic museum and the training school in which not only the local police but also those of the big provincial cities receive practical instruction," Mr. Eno said.

He gave high praise to Major Seyfarth, who conducted him around Berlin and who has been largely instrumental in perfecting the capital's traffic control, following the American and London systems.

Roofs Yield Clue Rain Water Is Best

Ancient metal roofs like those used on many European buildings and usually made of lead or copper, are more highly radioactive than the same metals freshly mined or prepared from the ores and this radioactivity has been traced to contact with rain. So M. Augustin Boularic and Mile. Madeleine Roy reported recently to the French Academy of Sciences, in Paris, summarizing many tests of metal out from new and old roofs in French cities. When this special radioactivity of metal roofs was first detected it was believed that it might be due to exposure to sunlight, the sun's rays being imagined capable of modifying the metal in some way so that radioactive elements were produced; for example, by transmitting atoms of lead into radium. Later investigations have shown, however, that the radioactivity of the roofs is concentrated, not in portions that are sunlit but in those that come into direct contact with rain. Experts on radioactivity long have known that rainwater is slightly radioactive probably as a result of absorbing radioactive gases usually present in tiny quantities in the air. This radioactivity of the rain seems to be absorbed by the metal of the roofs and to accumulate there. Many gardeners believe that fresh rain-water, just as it falls from the skies, is more beneficial to growing plants than any kind of artificial watering, even with a sprinkler to simulate rain. The discoveries about radioactive roofs suggest that this may be quite real and due to the radioactivity of the rain. Radioactive elements being known to have powerful effects on many kinds of living matter both plants and animals.

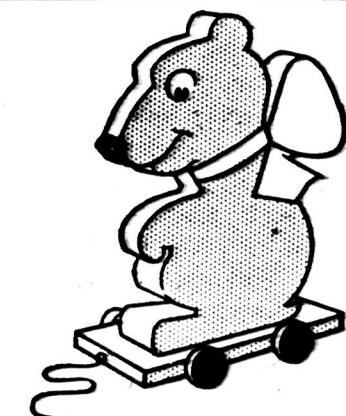

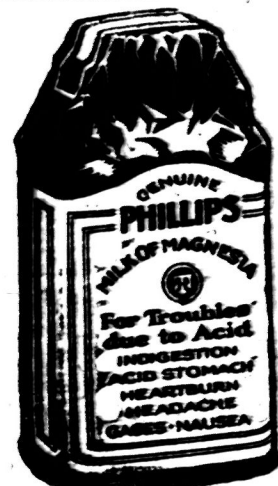
