



---REMINISCENCING---

Passing by one of the crude old cast iron cannons used at the siege of Sebastopol in 1855-6, we were reminded of the fierce struggle to prevent the Russians from bottling up the Black Sea for their own purposes by driving the Turks from Constantinople. The English and the French joined forces to frustrate this scheme and the Russian army was obliged to retire to their strong fortress in the Crimea. This stronghold was taken by the Allies in Sep. 1855, but it had cost a frightful loss of life, not only by the fighting, but by the epidemic of fever.

Canada's Natural Wealth
