ANOTHER WORLD JAMBOREE. Arrangements are being made for some 25,000 Boy Scouts from 45 countries to attend the next World Scout Jamboree in Hungary in 1933. The Jamboree will be held at Godolloy, the former estate of the late Emperor Francis Joseph I, which has been placed at the disposal of the Scouts by Admiral Horthy, the Regent of Hungary.

SCOUT STATUTES. Two Boy Scout Statutes appear over corner windows of the new Government "Confederation Block" at Ottawa. They commemorate public service rendered by Scouts, including the location of documents of the graves of the Fathers of Confederation for the Diamond Jubilee of 1927.
