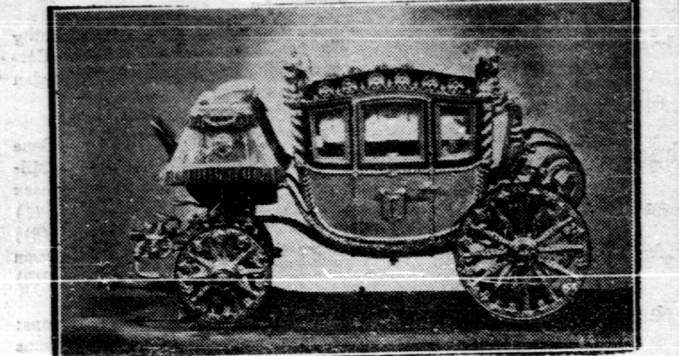

Golden Era For World Forecasted By Noted Economist

If World Governments Act Now—Advices International Parley—Otherwise Chaos Will Follow

London.—A copyrighted executive interview with the Associated Press, Sir George Paish, noted British economist, declared on December 19th, that world governments take the proper course, the greatest era of prosperity in history is just down the road.

On the other hand, he expressed the view that if they continue on their present course, the international economic fabric will go to smash within two months.

Continuing, he outlined to the Associated Press, the following steps, which he believes should be taken to assure the one and avert the other:

1.—Federal international conference to consider rehabilitation measures.

2.—Revision of Germany's reparations payments to insure eventual repayment of her commercial debts.
