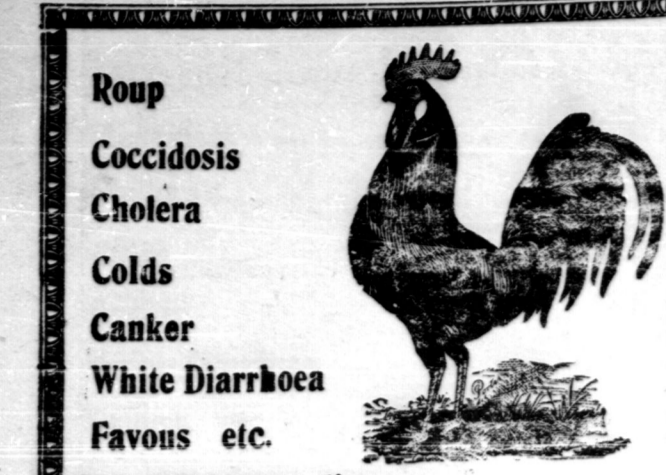

## Soil Train

On Wednesday and Thursday of next week, March 4th and 5th, the Soils and Crops Train will make three stops, at Caledonia, Jarvis and Hagersville.  
Commercial Fertilizer is a very live subject for discussion. Farmers are making more and more inquiries about fertilizer formulas, costs, suitability to certain crops, etc. The Soils car has been designed to answer some of these questions in graphic form.  
Soils Car, of course, also deals with soil fertility, liming, drainage, soil culture, conversation and use of manure, farm power, etc.  
Charts, diagrams and samples illustrate the better varieties of farm crops. Weed samples will be on display and methods of weed control, crop production and methods of decreasing production costs will be discussed.  
Half of the time at each stop will be taken up with lectures on soils and crop topics by special speakers on the train.  
The train will be at Jarvis, Thursday morning, March 5th, from 10:35 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
