Wilson, and Mrs. Donald Sinclair of

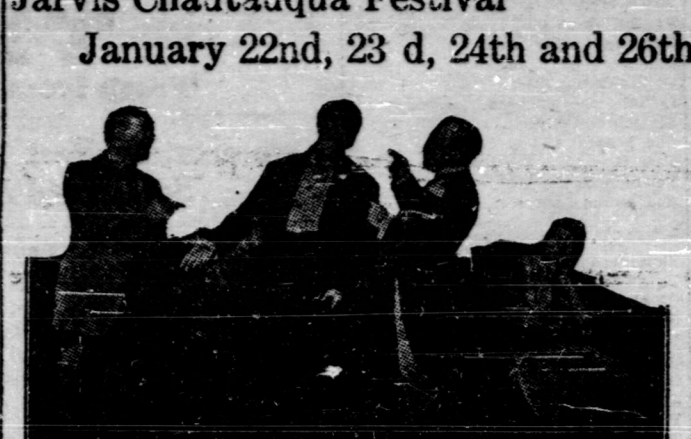
Walpole, Manitoba. J. Frank Wilson
