

The Value of Waterworks

A Municipal Waterworks System is of paramount mportance to every progressive community and, i mes a valuable asset to the community safeguard of the public's health by the elimination of possible epidemics unquestionably ranks first and should be given precedence over everything else. All Municipal Water Supply Systems are continually checked for impurities by the Department of Health, and a supply derived from a single source can be, under the strictest supervision at all times and community is securing their supply from individual wells, any one of which may and often does cause dard of purity. This is not always possib tion in other wells.

Municipalities without an adecuate supply of pure water are at a distinct disadvantage in their endeavor to attract industrial plants to locate in their community. One of the first quest one asked is invariably, ity One of the first questous saled a "How about your water supply, and what fire protection can you offer if we locate here?"

Statistics indicate that many industrial firms are seeking locations in smaller communities and that the proportion desiring to secure locations in smaller communities is rap idly approaching the percentage of new ind ustries established in urban neentres.

It is also of interest to know that whether you have a Waterworks System or not you are paying for it just the same. Fire In surance rates are based largly on the protection maintained in the event of fire If good protection is available and maintained in accord ance with the requirements of the Fire Under-writers the risk is minimized and the rates based accordingly. The reduction in many communities where Waterworks Systems have been installed has more than equaled the annual charge paid by the consumers for the water supply.

The daily charge for water for the average dwerling would be approximately five cents (.05c)

The daily charge for commercial services would be approximately eight cents(08c).
