### RADIO CENSUS

One of the questions to be asked in the coming census is—"Do you own a radio?" It may be suspected that the purpose of this is to locate persons who may not have paid their licence, or to assist private radio companies to make sales by letting them know what families do not own radios. This is wholly unfounded.

The answers to this question, as to whether or not a family owns a radio, are absolutely confidential—even to Government departments. The purpose of the question is to explore and analyze just what the radio audience of Canada is—where it is located, where it is densest, and how it is made up according to the different elements in the population. With the growing importance of radio, such information is indispensable to the formulation of satisfactory broadcasting. Radio is a further step of the Canadian standard of living, and some interesting studies may be expected as a result of the census question.

Grain fields throughout Hamilton County are suffering from the depredations of an insect known as the Web Worm. Numerous consultations have been brought to the attention of the Dept. of Agriculture at Cayuga and whole fields are being destroyed.

The worm which does the damage is a dark chocolate brown, varying to a light brown in color with dark spots along the back and sides. The head is usually black. It varies in size from about three-eighths to one-quarter of an inch in length and usually is quite active in movement over the ground. The web, from which it gets its name, may or may not be present.

Its attack is usually made on plants belonging to the grain and grass family, only, but this includes Oats, wheat, barley, and rye. With these crops is not to be recommended, at least until after June 15. Fortunately the worm does not seem to attack peas, beans or buckwheat. Several fields of peas and buckwheat noted along side of grain fields which were badly destroyed. Reseeding with one of these crops is reasonably safe. The worm will not eat poison, and therefore cannot be controlled by the use of the poison bran bait as recommended for cut worms.
