sion, after which proceedings were

immediately started. The work was

over half done when this committee

in their wisdom, appointed that well

tried and trusty veteran works

superintendent, William Parkinson, to

superintend the job, and believe it or

not, when William starts a job, the

grass quits growing until its finish-

ed. He says they didn't move the

from the air, in its finished state, we

agree that they moved some acres.

The job is certainly a credit to the

supervisor and all those who assisted

him in his endeavours to meet the

wishes of the committee.

The Jarvis Board of Trade cer-
