Jarvis Fair Had Record Attendance Over 100 Entries in Horse Classes
THE 78th ANNUAL EXHIBITION OF THE JARVIS AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY WAS A HUGE SUCCESS.
The 78th annual Fair held on Tuesday and Wednesday was the greatest success in years. The entry list exceeded any in the past twenty-five years and not only were the entries numerous but were unexcelled. On Tuesday forenoon the officials were on tip toe continually trying to find space for the exhibits, and at twelve o'clock the Secretary was still busy writing entry tickets and the entries for the vegetable display and the home grown farm products occupied a space of over five hundred square feet alone. Many new faces appeared this year among the exhibitors and when the judging was completed, appeared well satisfied. While below last year in the number of entries, the quality was far superior, and the old shell worn articles of the professional exhibitor were conspicuous by their absence. The domestic science and farm exhibits were all that could be desired and the judges very truthfully remarked that it was the equal of any large fair in the Province.
On Wednesday over one hundred entries in the horse classes alone were on hand. The ladies horse show from 1 o'clock until nearly six at night; on leaving he stated to the management that he had judged individual horses that would be a credit to the Royal Windsor Fair.
