OBITUARY JAMES BERKLEY McMICKEN

After a rather lengthy illness, James Berkley McMicken, a life long resident of this Village passed away at his home here on Tuesday last in his 83th year.

Mr. McMicken was born in the Village of Jarvis near the home in which he has spent the greater part of his life. He was a well known and respected citizen of this district, coming here from Normansville where previously he had been a foreman in the VanNo-man Foundry.

He married over sixty years ago, Jane Ann Watson, of Paris, who preceded him in death in 1912. He afterwards married Mrs. Fells, widow of the late William Fells, who survives him.

As a citizen he was much respected and took a deep interest in the upbuilding of the Village, but his chief interest was his home and surroundings which was ever one of the beautiful spots in the Village. He also held an abiding interest in Jarvis Lodge I.O.O.F. he being one of the charter members when organized some sixty years ago and under whose auspices the funeral to-day is being conducted.

He taught in the public school of Port Dover for a number of years and at one time was on the teaching staff of the Port Credit High School.
