A NEW YEARS MESSAGE

Before the next edition of the "Record" reaches you, we will have begun a new year or another period of measurement of time. New Year's Day as the name indicates, is the first day of the year. New Year's Day is not universal because in Russia, Greece and other countries where the Julian calendar is used, New Year's Day is celebrated on the English 13th of January. The Jewish New Year begins September 6th. Among the ancient Nations the time set as the beginning of the year differed also but all treated it with some special observance.

In the early Church any celebration of the day was at first forbidden, but later this day has been set aside as a Christian festival. Prior to the sixteenth century even in Christian countries different days were recognized as the beginning of the year, and it was not until 1752 that January 1st was declared by the Parliament of Great Britain as the opening day of the year for that country.

Regardless of history relating to this occasion and its observance in different countries, it is one time we can look back and also look ahead. The march through 1935 has been sure and steady with the result that at the end of the year a marked improvement generally is evident over the first and with every indication that the march will go forward unimpeded toward greater improvement throughout 1936. A spirit of optimism will do much to return the prosperous days of yore.
