Just a distant hum or a mere tickle on the head and off goes the old cow, her tail a-flag, in quest of the nearest watering hole; in the plunges right up to her neck or higher, the rest of the herd following. When she comes in to talking in the evening, her udder is covered with mud and she is down in her milk. "Flies a-bout" says the farmer, and leaves it to "Flies" again, but what is done? Perhaps she is the best of the breed for the cows and the calves are brought in during the heat of the day but what about the flies? It is conservatively estimated that the farmers of this province stand an annual loss of \$5,000,000 as a direct result of warble and heel flies which cause the warily condition found in cattle and start cattle running during the summer. The farmers of Haldimand county take a loss of \$65,000 or close to \$2.00 per day from this same condition.
