BRITAIN'S KING

The essence of the British monarchy is that the King, while lifted far above the nation, should also be the nation itself in its most characteristic form.

There is no place on earth for the superman, whose power he be conqueror or dreamer; his occupant must be recognized by his subjects as of like nature with themselves, exalted, indeed, but with the same outlook upon life, the same traditions and taste, the same thought and familiar virtue.

The Englishman, "the Englishman," as Goldsmith wrote, "is taught to love the King as his friend," and friendship involves a noble quality.

In the Platonic Utopia the king was the philosopher; it is more important that he should be the plain man.

The office in itself is a great thing but it may be made more potent by the personality of him who holds it.

It is not for the subject, in Dr. Johnson's famous words, to "bandy civilities with his Sovereign." But the historian must record that the King has added to the duties of the Crown a graciousness which springs from his own character.

He has given to ceremonial the bloom of friendliness. He has always possessed a high seriousness, and the note of faith and piety which he has often struck has not been the mere convention of his office.

He has walked securely in more difficult constitutional paths than any of his immediate predecessors. He has, in the face of courageous crises, shown a firmness of will which has inspired his people and led his throne. But in addition to all this he has diffused a spirit of simplicity and charity which has profoundly affected the national temper.

His quick sympathy and kindness have warmed the country, and done some thing to warm a chilly world. When news was breaking, his steadfastness has restored it, and when strife was fermenting, he has spoken the healing word. The power of the throne lies in what it is; but the authority of the King lies both in what he is and what he has done.

With the Queen and his family to aid him, he has made Britain not only a nation but a household.

Leadership does not consist only in a strong man imposing his will upon others. In that sense it has no meaning for a British Sovereign. But in a far profounder sense the King has shown himself a leader; the true task of leadership is not to put greatness into humanity, but to elicit it; since the greatness is already there.

That truth is the basis of all religion, it is the basis of all common sense, it is the basis of all progress of our mortal life. The King has led his people for he has evoked what is best in them—John Buchan in "The People's King," George V. in "Narrative of Twenty-five Years."

TAXATION ADDS \$50 PER YEAR TO OPERATING COSTS OF AUTOMOBILES

"What does it cost to operate an automobile?" This question has been asked by many motorists.

For the purpose of this article, the author has calculated the cost of operating a car on a variety of bases.

Usually, however, owners figure only on operating costs such as gasoline, oil, repairs, tires, garage rent, depreciation, but fail to take into account the effect of taxes on the total operating cost.

Figures taken from official records show that motorists paid out the following amounts in Canada in 1934: \$29,054,883 in gas tax, \$21,567,830 in registrations, \$33,905 in excise tax, \$247,819 in customs tax, while sales tax, computed at six per cent on the total retail value of all cars sold in that year amounted to \$4,547,127. The grand total, therefore, was \$56,750,654.

These taxes alone add an average of \$44 a month to the cost of operating each vehicle.

Club membership, insurance and other miscellaneous costs also figure in the total and all these extra costs which are added to the actual operating cost to obtain a correct figure.

Estimates in the United States based on state gasoline tax, federal gas and oil taxes, license fees and federal automotive taxes, amount to \$27 per motor vehicle in the District of Columbia to \$73.39 in Florida.

ALFALEA IMPROVEMENTS IN HALDIMAND COUNTY

The alfalfa crop is an important one in Haldimand County, comprising 19% of the hay lands of the area.

During the past four years several tests have been carried out by the Agricultural College of Ontario with the local department of Agriculture. Fertilizers have been applied at the general rate of 375 lbs. per acre on fairly large areas of alfalfa fields and yields have been compared.

The average unfertilized yield was 16.7 tons per acre. The best yield was 20.12 tons per acre. The average yield of 16,600 lbs. green alfalfa and 2-12-4 gave an average yield of 20,192 lbs. per acre. These results were obtained from similar tests in other parts of the province. The general experience is that phosphate fertilizers give a higher yield than do complete fertilizers. On the clay soils of Haldimand county this seems to be slightly different.

It is a well known fact that legumes, especially alfalfa, draw heavy nutrients from the soil. Hence the benefit that the addition of these plant foods is to this crop.

On the farm of Mr. S. A. Best, Cayuga, fertilizer was applied in 1931. Residual cuttings were taken in 1932. Summing up the entire yields for first and second cuttings for the two years the unfertilized alfalfa yielded 16.7 tons per acre. The phosphate treated topped with phosphate (0-12-15) yielded 21.9 tons per acre. The complete fertilizer (16-16-16) gave a gain of 3.7 tons per acre. The complete fertilizer made a total yield of 20.12 tons. The fertilizer applied in 1931 represented an investment of approximately \$5.00 per acre. Hence the increase obtained showed a net profit over the original cost. The plants were stronger and the hay was more abundant.

In 1933 a study was made of the response to 0-12-15 fertilizer applied at three different rates on two farms. Without fertilizer the average yield was 8.2 tons per acre. At 250 lbs. per acre the yield was 8.6 tons. At 375 lbs. it was 9.2 tons. At 500 lbs. it was 9.6 tons. It is obvious
