REMEMBRANCE
The observance of Armistice Day
on Monday, allows memories to
shift to an event in July 1914 when
Archduke Franz Ferdinand of Aus-
tria and his bride, Countess Sophie,
were killed by two pistol shots from
the hand of one Gavrilo Princip in
the city of Sarajevo. That event
brought grim tragedy to this world
which still feels the effect and shock
after more than seventeen years of
peace. This last great conflict
drew into its vortex nations of every
continent. It has been sometimes
called the Great War and the War
of Nations but no name can be sug-
gested which can fittingly describe
its magnitude.

When Marshal Foch met German
delegates in a Railway dining car
coach in the Compiègne Forest and
where the terms of the Armistice
were laid down and accepted it was
believed that the nations had emerged
from a conflict that would end
for time to come, that the hat-
red and brutality inherent in human
beings and the primitive passions
and racial antipathies had been sub-
dued to that point where mankind
would look with reverence the hap-
piness that lies in peace. Yet sev-
enteen years later we find a turbu-
lent Europe once more, with Italy
leading the way by transgression
upon Ethiopian Territory. In an
effort to protect a lesser nation,
leading powers of the world have
evoked economic sanctions against
that power and just how far this
will provoke Italy remains to be
seen. It surely leaves the world in
a tension, as it realizes that should
Italy's present aggression be
drawn into actual warfare that a
tragedy of greater effect upon the
world will be faced once again. Is
it any wonder then that we observed
Monday, November 11th with great
reverence than in the past?
