OTTAWA, October 21 - Puzzled politicians continued this week to study columns of figures in an attempt to gain a glimpse of the ever-mysterious public mind.

Mr. Stevens' failure to secure a seat for one of his followers was generally regarded as the most startling surprise of the election.

The decisive victory of the Canadian voters may be taken as an expression of one outstanding thought: a desire for a change.

The Conservative party's defeat marks practically the end of Mr. Bennett's political career, it is thought.

Financial problems and reform legislation passed by the House of Commons will be the main topics of discussion at the Premier's meeting.

The return of a Liberal government will result, it is agreed in a complete change of government policy on wheat.

Cancellation of the order-in-council setting the minimum prices will not be possible at the earliest date.

It will be recalled that shortly after his election Mr. Aberhart journeyed to Ottawa in search of a \$28,000,000 loan.
