Edmonton - Liquor is a luxury and consumers must pay, says Social Credit Premier William Abernethy in announcing new increased liquor taxes.

Edmonton - Contributing their action to the drought and stiff taxations the American Bakers Association, representative of the city's bread makers announces an increase of one cent a loaf.
