OBITUARY

MRS. JEAN MCGREGOR. Caledonia, Aug. 16—On Monday, August 8th, there died suddenly at her home in Caledonia Jean Thompson, widow of Donald McGregor in her seventy-fifth year. She was the eldest daughter of the late James Davidson, Glasgow, who came to this country from Abbotsford, Scotland, and who had been "retired" by Sir Walter Scott. A member of one of the pioneer families in the district she spent an active life in association with all worthy causes. She was a lifelong Presbyterian, deeply interested in all branches of its work, being the last charter member of the Women's Missionary Society. She was also a member of the Canadian Red Cross Society, assisted in organizing the W.C.T.U. both in its local and county branches, and only recently the recipient of a beautiful memorial to the work of her noble husband in the Bible Society. The services from her home in Caledonia on Thursday was conducted in the absence of the resident pastor, Rev. D. Jack, by an old family friend, Rev. A. Leslie Howard, Ph.D., of the Presbyterian Church, Georgetown, with music by Miss Dorothy Voelker, and W. A. Clapperton, soloist and choir master of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church, Hamilton. Interment was made in the Caledonia Cemetery. She is survived by three daughters, Mrs. A. E. James Caledonia; Miss Jean of E. James Caledonia; Dorothy; Miss Jessie Cantor of the MacGregor Concert Bureau, Caledonia, and two sons, Donald of Winnipeg Man. and James of Caledonia.
