



Measuring the infinitesimal

American Institute of Electrical Engineers, C. W. LaPierre described a
new application of the marvelously
sensitive photo-electric cell. He has

And yet Mr. La Pierrie's advice is positively coarse compared with the ultra-measurer of Professor R. Whiddington, an English scientist. Imagine a steel rod one-half an inch in diameter and twelve inches long. Imagine this rod held horizontally, with one of its ends in a vise and a fly on the opposite end. The weight of the fly will bend the rod and Whiddington's electical instrument can measure the amount of the bending, provided that it is as much as one five-hundred militiation of an inch.
