

Miss Ann Adam's Recipe for Bran Muffins

1 1/2 cups bran
1 1/2 cups flour
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1 cup milk
1 egg
1/2 cup oil

Mix the bran with the sifted flour in a medium bowl. Make a well in the center and pour in the milk and oil. Beat the egg and add to the well. Mix the bran and flour mixture with the milk and oil mixture. Add the salt and baking powder. Bake in a hot oven, 400° F., for 15 to 20 minutes. A few chopped dates, lightly coated with some of the melted oil, may be added.

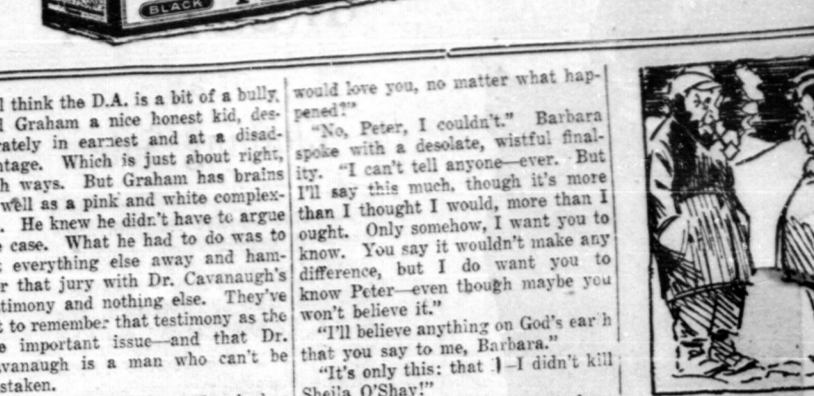

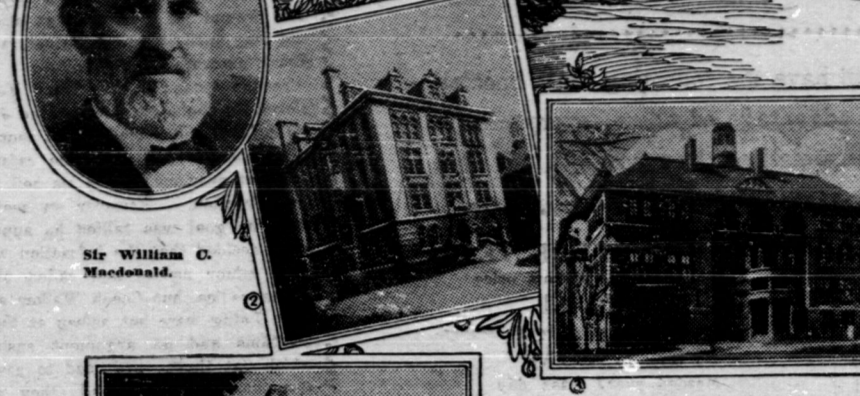
Back Yard Beautification

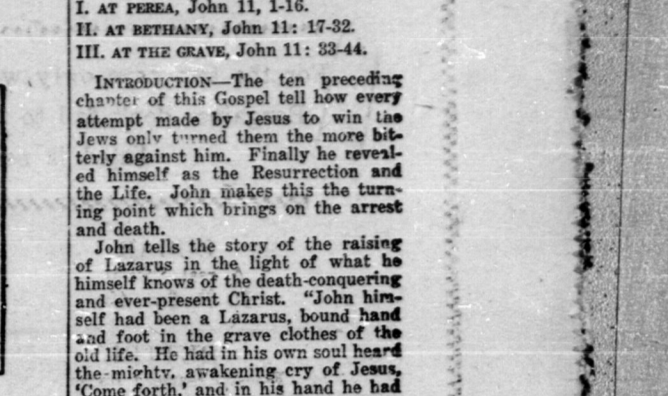
