

There may have been a touch of humor behind Jesus' question to Philip, v. 5. Philip lived by figures rather than by faith. He believed what he could see. If he could work it out on paper, he would believe it possible, his calculations (v. 7) left out the chief factor,—Jesus himself. The small boy with the big lunch (v. 9) is the only possibility that comes to Andrew's nind. "But what are these among so many?" Many a worthwhile achievement has been frustrated by the "but" of timidity. Christ can produce mighty results from the slenderest possible means.
