

Do plants have brains? Something roughly analgous to an area of highly sensitive nervous tissue in animals is one of the complicating factors being taken into consideration in experiments with plant be-havior now under way at the Smith-

nature of which remains uncertain. The Smithsonian experiments are carried out with oat seedlings. The purpose is to study the curious phe-nomenon of "phototropism," the tendency of a plant to bend toward or away from light. Much depends on the section of the plant upon which the illumination is allowed to fall. "There appears to plant," says Dr. Earl S. Johnston, Smithsonian plant physiologist, more or less localized region capable of receiving a stimulus. It has shown that the most sensitive tion of a coleoptile, the leaf s surrounding the bud of an ascending shoot, is the first 50 microns of the The first millimeter is 160

Furthermore, Dr. Johnston explains, if only one side of the tip of the seedling is illuminated the stem will bend in the direction of the light, but the bending will take place toward the base. It would seem at first sight that the plant behaves very much like an animal. It sees with its "eyes." Then its "legs" move toward what it sees.
