





The Bible never glosses over the fact that even brothers, springing from the same parents, may be divided by bitterest strife where one would expect only love. Such rivalry is weirdly fascinating because it is so true to life.

Jacob and Esau chose different occupations. Their choice revealed at the outset the natural bent of their dispositions, which their vocations, once chosen, tended to confirm. Esau was a hunter; Jacob was a shepherd. Jacob is called a "plain" man; the Hebrew word here suggests that his was a settled mode of life. Esau loved the open spaces, with the exhilicaration of the chase; Jacob preferred his tent, and his flocks and herds. 
