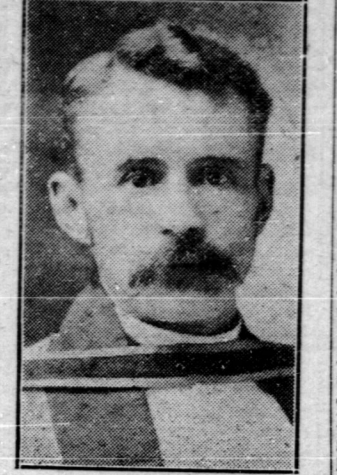

Rev. J. Hirst Ross Leaving Jarvis

Closing a Ministry of Forty-three Years Service

It was with extreme regret that the citizens of Jarvis and surrounding country learned a few weeks past that Rev. J. Hirst Ross, the beloved Rector of St. Paul's Anglican Church here was to complete his ministry at the end of April, and that St. Paul's Church was to lose a devoted and faithful Rector and the Village to lose an honored citizen.

He has had a wide experience since taking Holy Orders and has succeeded in bringing many struggling and divided parishes into perfect unity.

He was born in the City of Hamilton in 1865, where he also received his early academic training, after which he attended Trinity College, Toronto, taking a Licentiate Course in Theology.

He was ordained Deacon in St. Peter's Church, Toronto, in 1890 and exalted to the Priesthood in 1891.

His first parish was at Ball's Corners, where he remained a year, before going to St. George's Church, Guelph, until 1897 when he was forced on account of ill health, to take a complete rest.

He was transferred to Burlington and Chippewa, coming to Jarvis in 1912, his first appointment here continued for seven years, when he was asked to take the Cayuga Parish, where he also continued for seven years, after which he spent four years in Palmerston where his work was highly complimented and in 1930 he returned to Jarvis, and it was fully expected that he would continue in this charge for many years to come.

But the untimely coming of his illness has been a decided loss, not only to the Anglican Community of this Parish but to the citizens in general. Mr. and Mrs. Ross and daughter, Una, intend moving to Toronto early in May, where Mr. Ross intends taking a six months rest, after which his future is undecided, but we pray that his days may be long in the land, to continue in his own inimitable way the great service to which his life has been consecrated, and the "Record" joins with countless others, in wishing for Mr. and Mrs. Ross, many many years of peaceful good health in the thoughts of a fruitful life spent in the service of his Master.
