The Dominion Experimental Station at Kapuskasing, Ontario has been established in this district in 1912. The first-free period was 103 days in 1932, 125 days in 1931 and 119 days in 1930, compared to an average of 73 days over a period of 15 years. Many, however, the frost-free period would be interested to know if this is justified.

It is generally conceded that the amount of growth is measured up by the rainfall and that the maturity of the grain is in direct relation with the amount of sunshine. Over a period of 15 years the average monthly precipitation during the five growing months was 2.84 inches and from 1919 to 1932 inclusive, an average of 2.06 hours of sunshine was recorded monthly during the same five growing months. Both the rainfall and the hours of sunshine are considered sufficient for a good growth and perfect maturity of grain.
