



Mine Roofs Saved New York .- A new kind of meta pillar that squeezes down a little like a sponge to save mine roofs from talling in was announced to the American Institute of Mining Metallurgical Engineers last week.

The plastic metal is a special con position of lead. This is set between two telescopic sections of a rigid metal pillar. When the roof gets too heavy, the pillar, instead of buck ling, compresses the plastic metal as if it were rubber. The pillars can shorten in this manner from 18 21 inches. Compressible pillars like this or have been much used in mining, but not heretofore with plastic metal.
