"BOOST THE BOOSTERS"

That the bridge bridge on the townline between Canboro and North Cayuga, south of No. 3 Highway, which was recently agreed on by the County, be repaired for the present season by replacing some of the plank and temporarily supporting the centre of the bridge with a timber trestle.

8. That Mr. Harold Hunter, the owner of lots 10 and 11, in the 1st Concession north of the Rainham Road in the Township of Dunn be paid \$75.00 for the property required for the realignment of Road No. 12, at the new Armours' Creek bridge and the supply of approximately 2000 cubic yards of earth to be taken from the adjacent part of his farm, the present fence to be replaced in as good a condition as at present on the new road limit and that the Engineer be instructed to supply a legal description of the property to the County Solicitor for preparation of a legal transfer.

9. That two plank bridges on side roads entering the Hutchinson Road (No. 13) which are in very bad condition and are within the present right of way of the county road be repaired at an estimated cost of \$50.00 each work to be carried out by the Township of Moulton and the cost to be divided between the County and the Township due to the fact that the drain is lower than the road and rain to form an outlet for the adjacent farm lands, the County to pay 75% and the Township 25% of the cost.

10. That the fill required for the realignment of the River Road (No. 12) at the Armours' Creek Bridge be carried out with men and teams by day labour, the work to be begun at once and carried out as expeditiously as possible.

11. That in the matter of entrance culverts, each owner be provided with one entrance consisting of 12 feet

of pipe, the pipe to be supplied and the entrance constructed by the County. Any additional entrance or addition in width or entrance shall be divided between the owner and the County, the owner to pay for the additional pipe required and the County to place and construct the entrance to the size and grade of pipe to be in every case as required by the County.

12. That steel treads to eliminate noise and stiffen the floor be placed on the Canboro Bridge over the Oswego Creek and the bridge across Stony Creek on the Selkirk-Balmoral Road (No. 7).

13. That the Engineer be instructed to write the Department of Public Works in the matter of the contract which has been recently let for the filling at Port Maitland, which will entail heavy trucking over the Byngport Maitland Road (No. 11) and that the engineer be also instructed to take whatever steps are necessary to safeguard this road from damage due to excessive loads while this work is being carried out.

14. That the Engineer be instructed in so far as this year's appropriation will permit, to repair the Macadam roads and put them in as good a shape as possible before arrival of winter weather.

15. That the fill necessary for widening the roadway at the Lishman Bridge on Road No. 17 be placed by day labour as soon as possible, the filling to be obtained from the property of Mr. Lishman, the adjacent owner, and that the Solicitor be instructed to prepare an agreement with Mr. Lishman for the ultimate widening and grading of the road at this point, the completion of the work to be left until next year.
