PROVINCE OFFERS \$40,000,000 LOAN

Premier Announces New Ontario Loan

Toronto, January 15, 1934.—One of the first acts of Premier George S. Henry on assuming his office as Provincial Treasurer is his announcement of a new \$40,000,000 Province of Ontario Debenture Issue dated January 16th, 1934 and offered in January 16th, 1934 and offered in January 16th, 1934.

Three-year 4% Debentures due January 16th, 1937, yielding 4.36% to maturity.

Six-year 4% Debentures due January 16th, 1940, yielding 4.59% to maturity.

Fifteen-year 4 1/2% Debentures due January 16th, 1949, yielding 4.78% to maturity.

The proceeds of the issue will be used to retire short-term indebtedness incurred for capital expenditures of the Hydro-Electric Power Commission and of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway Commission.
