COUNTY COUNCIL MINUTES

SECOND SESSION
FIRST DAY
Cayuga, March 28th, 1934

Council met pursuant to adjournment. All the members present except Fay Head, Reeve of Hagersville.

The Warden in the chair. Moved by Councillor Ocker, seconded by Councillor Kerr, that this Council resume business with the Warden in the chair. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Anderson, seconded by Councillor Kerr, that the minutes as read be adopted. Carried.

Westworth, re Police Systems.

Moved by Councillor Ocker, seconded by Councillor Anderson, that a by-law be introduced and read a first time authorizing the Warden and Clerk to execute an agreement with the following parties for the following purposes: To construct a creek bed 50 feet in bottom width on the south side of the Rainham Road as straightened across the lands of the party of the First Part, the party of the second part to construct an eight-wire fence along the south side of said new creek throughout the entire frontage of the said lands along the west side of lot 25, Con. 4, for the sum of seventy five dollars.

Frederick W. Clark — Construct a new channel with a bottom width of forty five feet on the easterly side of and adjacent to the side road of the runs along the west side of lot 25, Con. 4, for the sum of seventy five dollars.

Vernon Lockie — To purchase for the County, a strip of land 60 feet in width being 33 feet on each side of a centre line as staked across a portion of the said lot for a straightening of the East River Road, the County to reset certain fences and provide certain road metal as arranged on the ground in Lot 17, Con. 3, S. of Talbot for the sum of \$120.

Christian Sturdy — The County to purchase a triangular parcel of land being the southwest corner of Lot 1, Con. 2, north of the Rainham Road in the Township of Dunn, the north east boundary of the said parcel being a circular curve of radius 477 feet rounding the said corner and the approximate acreage be grized hereunder as follows: The parcel originally laid out in a straight line across the said lands for the sum of \$100.00.

Christina Sturdy — The County to purchase a triangular parcel of land being the southwest corner of Lot 1, Con. 2, north of the Rainham Road in the Township of Dunn, the north east boundary of the said parcel being a circular curve of radius 477 feet rounding the said corner and the approximate acreage be grized hereunder as follows: The parcel originally laid out in a straight line across the said lands for the sum of \$100.00.

Arthur Ricker — To reconstruct the creek running behind the barn on Lot 3, Con. 1, Cambridge, as to carry the water away from the road and approach the culvert on the right at this point more nearly at right angles to the road, all as staked on the ground, the said work being carried out so as to leave a watered place opposite the barnyard opposite the proposed creek diversion for a consideration of \$50 to be paid upon commencement of work.

Milton S. Sundry — The County to purchase a sufficient strip from the west limit of the Robinson Road through Lot 1, Con. 1, Indian River, Township of Canboro, to permit the widening of the Awarit ditch from Mud Creek to the C.N. Ry., the present fence to be removed and a food condition as at present for the sum of \$100 an unreasonable damage for any crops damaged.

Alex Buzina — The County to purchase a triangular parcel of land containing approximately sixteenth of an acre at the S. W. angle of Lot 6 in the 3rd Con. north of Lake Erie in the Township of Moulton, the N. E. boundary of the said parcel being an arc of a circle having a radius of 467 feet around said corner and the party of the first part (Alex Buzina) agrees to supply the necessary teaming and permit the moving of the barn adjacent to the said parcel and the party of the second part (County) to supply the necessary teaming for the sum of seventy-five dollars per acre.

Robert Smith — The County to purchase a triangular parcel of land for the sum of seventy-five dollars per acre. The S. E. boundary of which is 33 feet from the centre line as staked for a straightening of the Hutchinson Road at the N. W. angle of Lot 9, Con. 2 in the Township of Moulton, containing approximately 1/4 of an acre of land for the sum of seventy-five dollars per acre.

Emack Smith — The County to purchase a triangular strip of land the boundary of which is 33 feet from the centre line as staked for a straightening of the Hutchinson Road at the S. E. angle of Lot 9, Con. 1 south of the Forks Road in the Township of Moulton being approximately one quarter of an acre of land for the sum of seventy-five dollars per acre. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Parkinson, seconded by Councillor Birt, that the by-law authorizing the execution of agreements with Joseph Cronk, Frederick W. Clark, Vernon Lockie, Freeman Steale, Christian Sturdy, Arthur Ricker, Milton S. Sundry, Alex Buzina, Robert Smith and Emma Smith, be read a second time. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Cotter, seconded by Councillor Kerr, that the by-law authorizing the Warden and Clerk to execute agreements with Joseph Cronk, Frederick W. Clark, Vernon Lockie, Freeman Steale, Christian Sturdy, Arthur Ricker, Milton S. Sundry, Alex Buzina, Robert Smith and Emma Smith, be read a third time, signed and numbered and entitled a by-law as in the original motion. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Laidlaw, seconded by Councillor Birt, that the by-law authorizing the Warden and Clerk to execute a contract with the Government of the Province of Ontario under the provisions of the Unemployment Relief Act, 1933 be read a second time. Carried.
