

"This I say therefore." Paul has been speaking of the growth of the church of Jesus Christ. "And testify in the Lord." Paul was living in the Christ, as Christ was living in him. "That ye no longer walk as the Gentiles also walk." The churches to which Paul was writing were Gentile churches led up out of dense heathenism into the light of the gospel. "In the vanity of their mind." Vanity here means emptiness.


