THE PROPER CARE OF YOUR AUTOMOBILE Closed Car Tops

MOST automobile owners appreciate that it isn't the original cost, it's the upkeep that makes motoring expensive. Yet, few realize that they can avoid many of the major expenses of an automobile with a little care.

It has been told previously how the finish of the car may be preserved indefinitely by regular cleaning and waxing. This is true also of the closed car top. If care is taken of the top when it is new it's life may be prolonged indefinitely at little expense.

Most closed car tops consist of fabric which is coated with a rubber composition and finished with a black baked enamel. Exposure to the weather causes the varnished finish of the top to slowly distinct the coating of properly formulated top dressing.
