### Veranda Bridges Call For Little Homemade Cakes

Several varieties of little cakes very different in appearance and taste, can be made at the same time and they are so popular for bridge teas, or in fact at any time, that they are apt to be eaten up before the special occasion has come about.

### Chocolate Nut Tea Cakes

1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour, 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 cup butter or other shortening, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs well beaten, 3 squares unsweetened chocolate, 3/4 cup broken nut meats, 3/4 cup milk, 1/4 teaspoon vanilla.

### Old-Time Brownies

1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour, 3/4 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-3/8 cup sugar, 5 egg yolks beaten until thick and lemon colored, 2 1/2 squares of sweetened chocolate (melted), 1 cup sour cream, 1 cup walnut meats (broken), 1 teaspoon vanilla.

### Chocolate Macaroon

2 egg whites, 1 cup sugar, 3/4 teaspoon salt, 3/4 teaspoon vanilla, 1 1/2 squares unsweetened chocolate (melted), 1/2 cups coconut southern style shredded.

### Ravigote Dressing

Mash the yolks of 3 hard-boiled eggs until they are smooth. Then mix in 4 tbsp. of salad oil, 3 tsp. cream, 1 tsp. vinegar, 1 tsp. salt, 1/2 tsp. paprika and a little paprika, 2 tsp. chopped green onion, and 2 tsp. finely chopped hard-boiled egg whites may be added. — Loretta E. ## SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

### LESSON VII SOWING AND REAPING (Temperance Lesson)

Galatians 6: 1-10

**GOLDEN TEXT**—Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man sows, that shall he also reap. Galatians 6: 7.

**Devotional Reading:** Galatians 5: 16-24.

**Beginner Topic:** Jesus' Friend Tells Us to Help.

**Lesson Material:** Galatians 6, 2-8, 10.

**Memory Verse:** Love one another. John 15: 12b.

1. "Brethren, even if a man be overtaken in any trespass." That is, if he be detected in the trespass which he has committed, before he can escape. If a man's sin is never discovered, then the problem of the relationship between himself and others never arises. "Ye who are spiritual." That is, those who are in the Holy Spirit, who walk in the Word of God, such as Paul was referring to in the immediately preceding passage (5: 25). "Restore such a one." The verb here translated "restore" often means to "re-see" or "re-see what is injured" (Matt. 5: 21; Mark 1: 19). "In a spirit of gentleness." The restoration of a fallen brother is not to be undertaken in a distant or haughty spirit, or in a hard, dictatorial, or censorious style, which dwells bitterly on the sin, or brings its aggravations into undue relief. "Looking to thyself, lest thou also be tempted." It is a noticeable thing that men normally weak in any given direction are apt to be the severest judges of those who err in the same respect, just as people who have risen out of poverty are often the hardest towards the poor.

2. "For if a man thinketh himself to be something when he is nothing." "Be not deceived; God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man sows, that shall he also reap." As long as the law of this verse—that whatever a man sows he will reap—is allowed to apply to nature, to sowing seed in the ground, every living person will admit its sovereignty and truthfulness, and rejoice in it; but when this law is lifted up into moral and spiritual realms, the men are often deceived into believing that, no matter what kind of seed is sown, the harvest will be good. "What if he knoweth not what he is sowing?" "So then, as we have opportunity, let us work that which is good toward all men, and especially toward them that are of the household of the faith." In this verse the teaching of the entire preceding passage seems to be summed up. The church of Christ on earth is frequently designated as the household of God (1 Tim. 3: 15; Peter 2: 5; Heb. 3: 12; 19: 1).

## HOW TO MAKE ICED TEA

## Any of a Dozen Women Capable of Heading Govt.

### Lena M. Phillips Believes Woman Would Make Excellent President of U.S.

A leading American feminist believes that at least 12 American women are as competent in administrative ability, training and background as the majority of men who have held the office.

While American political parties are in the midst of Presidential times, Lena M. Phillips, named seven women who, she thought, could fill the job.

Among the seven mentioned are Mrs. Franklin Roosevelt, Ruth Bryan Owen, Frances Perkins, a former member of Congress (Ruth Simmons), Julia Florence Allen, Josephine B. Rorer, mining executive and Assistant Secretary of the Treasury; and Miss Gilbreth, university instructor and consulting engineer.

Most of the women have been married and five have children. In fact, Dr. Gilbreth is the mother of 12.

Miss Phillips believes the day is sure to come when a woman will be installed in the White House. These women, she says, have sufficient understanding of "fundamental social and economic problems" for the job and "women in general have a more detached approach to political problems than men, and therefore fewer axes to grind."

Miss Phillips has no patience with the widespread discussion of the economic result of "women's blouses" and "the truth is," she says, "that men have taken over the old days' women's made the clothes and the candles for light, and the process of raising vegetables and fruits."

Then came the machine age and men began to take up our jobs — to make clothes, cook, knit, gas and electric plants, and erect canning factories. In a comparatively short time they took most of our jobs and then complained when we went into factories to try to get them back.

"A woman has a right to earn her money on the same terms as a man. When she loses her job what happens, she has to make her own dress, hats, bread and canned goods — all the things that she previously had done and that is no help to a woman's industry."

## Shining White Teeth Depend on Daily Care

White, sparkling teeth are important to any woman's beauty. Nature may not have blessed you with nice teeth, but you can make them shine. There is no excuse for dingy, faded teeth that spoil your smile.

You know, of course, that you ought to see your dentist at least twice a year and that you should brush your teeth two or three times a day. Make sure that you brush correctly — downward on the upper, upward on the lower ones and with rotary motion inside and out. Be careful not to force the gums away from the teeth. Ask your dentist to recommend a dentifrice which will remove stains as well as food particles and film.

You ought to use dental floss at least once a day. This removes foreign substances which cannot be reached with a tooth brush. Remember, too, that it's a good idea to use a mouth wash after each cleansing.

Select toothbrushes (everyone needs two) with firm (not soft, but not harsh) bristles. Keep them hanging up so the bristles will have a chance to dry thoroughly after each brushing. If, in spite of this they seem to get too soft, rinse with the salt water dry on the brush.

Incidentally, baking soda is one of the finest cleansing agents for stained teeth. You may not like the taste of it, but it will do the trick. If your budget doesn't allow for a commercially prepared mouth wash, try plain salt water.

## Coatless Club Shows Big Gains Railway Revenue

C.N.R. June Report Shows \$1,027,511 Increase in Month of June

MONTREAL. — Operating revenue for Canadian National Railways increased \$1,027,511 to \$14,739,748 in the month of June, 1936, compared to the same month last year. It was reported recently. Operating expenses for the same period increased \$522,324 to \$14,730,324.

For the six month period to the 30th of June, 1936, operating revenue increased \$5,323,643 to \$36,441,488 over the corresponding period of 1935, while operating expenses increased 5,092,190 to \$32,349,298.
