CELESTIAL CHURCH NANTICOKE OBSERVING 50th ANNIVERSARY

Cheapside were constituted a mission by themselves with Rev. John D. Hill as first incumbent 1872-1874. Then followed Rev. John H. Fletcher 1874-1875, and Rev. Percy Smith 1875-78. Under Rev. Smith the present Rectory was begun and almost completed. The next rector was Rev. Charles Johnston in 1878 who remained only a short time. Then followed Rev. John Seaton, 1879-1880. Then followed Rev. Alfred Bonny, 1881-1883; Rev. E. H. Walker McWilliam, 1887; Rev. G. H. Molony, 1887-1890. Rev. G. H. Hill for a few months. From June 1906 Mr. J. D. Hill, a student of Wycliffe College, Toronto; and at various times in the absence of the incumbent in case of a vacancy, services have been held by two licensed lay preachers, Mr. A. R. Low, and Mr. S. A. Thompson, both of Nanticoke. In June 1901 the Bishop appointed Rev. H. C. Brown as incumbent. In 1902 William Harold Cotton was born at Nanticoke and baptised in Christ Church. Mr. Cotton is very well known as a former member of the Toronto Maple Leaf Professional Hockey Club.

The following ministers succeeded Rev. Cotton: Rev. Douglas G. Brown, 1904-1908; Rev. H. J. Leake, 1908-1911; Rev. R. H. Brett, 1911-1912; Rev. R. Curzon Jones, 1912-1914; Rev. E. F. Maunell, 1922-1925; Rev. C. J. Lamb, 1925-1927; Rev. L. C. Secrest, 1927-1929; Rev. W. Gibson, 1929-1932; Rev. M. Brett, 1932 to the present time.

A fine new brick Memorial Hall was erected beside the church in 1931 by the C. Brock Hall family in memory of the late Colonel C. Brock Hall. This was dedicated by Bishop Owen during the incumbency of Rev. W. Gibson. In 1932 St. Paul's Church, Jarvis and Christ Church Nanticoke were joined into one parish with the minister residing at Jarvis while the services at Cheapside were conducted by the rector of Christ Church, Hagersville. The present brick church at Nanticoke was built in 1833. In 1836 the congregation on Dec. performed on the 30th day of December, 1836, by Bishop Hamilton. The first service was held in the new church on January 2nd, 1837, just fifty years ago.
