

HAVE you ever watched a sharp-shooter in the act of pulling the shooter in the act of pulling the trigger of his gun? If you have, you will agree that there would be little excuse for blurred pictures, if the snapshooter, in pushing the shutter release of his camera, would emulate the sharpshooter's technique.

When the rharpshooter gets a bead on the bull's-eye he does not pull the trigger with a jerk. He exerts a slow, steady pressure. The reason is that, if he does not pull the trigger in this fashion, his aim will be jerked off the bull's-eye. He probably will hit the target some where, but not ring the bell for a perfect shot. So, with a camera, violent pressure on the shutter release jerks the camera and spoils the shot. There will be a picture on the film all right, but not with the sharp outlines that make a perfect snapshot, because a camera in motion while the lens is open is like a maching un sweeping its fire across the whole target. The resuit is blur. Just as the sharpshooter practices pulling the trigger, it is a good thing for the snapshooter to practice pressing the shutter release.
