Method: Mix the sugar, corn-Barcelona Steak

Slice left-over steak and arrange in a baking dish. On top place sliced onions, 1 cup canned tomatoes, chopped green pepper and a little parsley. Add ½ teaspoon salt, ½ teaspoon sugar and pepper to taste. Bake until the steak is thoroughly beated and the flavors blended.

Method: Mix the sugar cornstarch and salt; blend with 2 cup cook in top of double boiler until thickened. Stir frequently to prevent sticking. Cook at least 15 minutes. Cool, add vanilla; beat up well and pour into sherbet glasses. Serve with chopped pecans and thin cream.
