

WARNING TO HOME OWNERS

At this particular season of the year the fire At this particular season of the year the fire hazard from defective chimneys is at its height. A great many citizens unthoughtfully neglect to ascertain the condition of their chimneys with respect to safety. The hazard is increased when a wood or coal stove is put up for the winter months in place of a gas stove, as the gas deteriorates the material of the chimney and forms deposits susceptible to combustion, which might

deposits susceptible to combustion, which might easily ignite from a spark from a wood fire.

I would respectfully request all residents of this Village to immediately have their chimneys inspected for their own safety and to avoid the disaster of conflagration.
