## Amateur Night Show Saturday July 25th, 8.30 P.M.

Second Community Draw Attracts Larger Attendance... Reduction Made In Hydro Rates... Power Users Also Benefit By Lower Rating... The local Hydro Commission were recently advised of a reduction on the power supplied to the town from the Ontario Hydro Commission. The interim rate has been reduced from \$42.00 to \$40.00 per horse power per year. This rate went into effect on January 1st of this year. The saving to date on power used amounts to approximately \$130.00. A reduction has also been made in the power rates, commencing July 1st. The first fifty hours has been reduced from 3.1c to 2.8c per kilowatt hour, while the second fifty hours was given a reduction from 2.0c to 1.8c. All additional consumption is charged at 3.3c. Domestic and Commercial users rates will remain the same. During 1935 the cost per street light containing a 100 watt multiple lamp was \$10.00. For 1936 this cost has been increased to \$11.00. In 1935 the Village paid the Hydro Commission \$800.00 for street lighting. According to the amount of hydro used, this amount was \$125.00 in excess of the actual amount of hydro used. Therefore \$125.00 will be returned to the general account of the Village from the local Hydro Commission.

## CITIZENS REQUESTED TO USE CAUTION

We have been requested by Fire Chief, William Elliott to caution all citizens of the danger of bonfires during this unusual dry season. In the event of a fire at this time, the local Department would be practically helpless through lack of water. Although we have not been menaced with grass fires, as have some municipalities, we should not for a moment relax our caution and take a chance, regardless of how badly we might want to get rid of that accumulated rubbish. The present dry condition of the grass, requires very little to create a blaze and smokers are also cautioned as to the disposal of cigarette butts, and in themselves are sufficient to start a grass blaze and from there who knows. The situation is grave and it is hoped the citizens of Jarvis will exercise every precaution until the dry season is over.
