SPRINGTIME SALAD



Hi-hum! And summer is almost here and how Canadians welcome it after this long, expensive winter. Everyone wants something "different" to eat these balmy days — something filling but not heavy, tangy with sourness, salads with a body as very as anything for just their appetites and layered cheese and apple is one of the most refreshing. Serve it with hot tea biscuits or scones to improve your standing as a smart hostess.

Layered Cheese and Apple Salad

1 package quick-setting jelly powder, lemon flavour; 1 pint boiling water; 1 tablespoon lemon juice, one teaspoon salt; 1 red apple cut in one-quarter inch dice; 1 teaspoon sugar; 3 ounces cream cheese; 1/2 cup walnut meats broken.

Dissolve jelly powder in boiling water. Add 1 tablespoon lemon juice and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Combine apple, sugar, a dash of salt, and remaining one tablespoon lemon juice. When jelly powder is slightly thickened, fold apples into 1/2 of jelly powder mixture. Turn into mold. Chill until firm. Place remaining jelly powder in bowl of the rotary egg beater until fluffy and thick like whipped cream. Pour in warm water. Pour over firm first cheese and nuts. Soviet Anxious About Birth Rate

Enacts New Legislation With Objective of Population of 3,000,000

MOSCOW. — The increasing importance which the Soviet Union is attaching to the raising of children is shown recently in an announcement that new laws were being drawn up to extend financial responsibility for children's upkeep to bachelors.

The laws will set up a special tax for single men and childless couples, for will provide state financial aid for families with many children and will put a tax on divorcees.

Regulations also will be enacted to prohibit certain operations except where they are demanded in the interests of health. This is a reversal of the former Soviet viewpoint which facilitated such operations.

Aron Solts chairman of the Supreme Court and member of the committee framing the new laws, asserted they were necessary to give the Soviet Union more people.

He declared that although the Soviet woman has been raised on the basis of "absolute equality" with man, she "cannot be released from the great and honorable duty" of bringing children into the world.

The Soviet "planning commission" forces a population of 300,000,000 by 1971 as a result of the new laws to increase the birth rate under the new laws.

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON VII. — Thos 28: 15. JESUS VISITS HONESTY. — Luke 18.

GOLDEN TEXT — Thos 28: 15. — "And he entered into the temple, and the teaching of the parable that follows, took place during the month of March, A.D. 30; the triumphal entry into Jerusalem occurred on Sunday, April 2, A.D. 30; and the second purification of the temple occurred on the next day, April 3.

The city of Jericho witnessed the conversion of Zacharias and the teaching of the parable of the ten pounds; the events occurring in the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem are to be located on the Mount of Olives and the city of Jerusalem, near which Christ was leading them from the last four days of his coming down. "And began verses of the chapter describe events taking place in the temple in the city of Jerusalem.

"And he entered and was passing through Jericho. And behold, a man called by name Zacharias. And he was a chief publican. This is, undoubtedly, an official title, and means that he was, in our language, a commissioner of taxes. "And he was of the age of Jesus was not the last age in which public officials grew wealthy as servants of the government, nor was the ancient Roman Empire the only sphere in which this was possible.

"And he sought to see Jesus who he could not for the crowd, because he was little of stature. North Ontario Flirts With Thought of a New Province

The suggestion advanced by J. E. Crawford, M.L.A. for Fort William, that Northern Ontario may in the future secede and form a separate province is not a new one. It has been made from time to time for over a generation. Indeed, a quarter century or more ago tentative steps toward such an end had made considerable progress.

That the idea should come up frequently is not entirely surprising and while in recent years it has been heard more often from the northwestern section of the province between the lakehead and Manitoba, Alberta can sympathize with its viewpoint. Northern Ontario is a vast area, larger than any country in Europe except Russia, larger than the United Kingdom and France taken together. Alberta alone is larger than several European countries.

Naturally in such a large territory there is a wide variety of problems and the people of the north have not infrequently felt that the Ontario Legislature has properly appropriated its resources nor the diversity of its needs.

Kipling once wrote of England that "she thinks her Empire still is the Strand and Holborn Hill." And similarly many in the north feel that the Ontario Legislature as a group think that Northern Ontario is the narrow strip along the N. & N.O. The development of gold mines in Michigan, Long Lac, Patricia is breaking down that view but a proper understanding of the area would have brought that development sooner.

It is agreed that various Ontario Governments, including the present one, have spent large sums in the north and have done a great deal to ward off the difficulty at times in getting the support of Old Ontario members for their program.

It is not surprising then, if Northern Ontario sometimes flirts with the idea of a separate province, that the members of whose legislature would naturally be more conversant with its problems than a legislature made up for the most part of men unacquainted with the north.

On the other hand, of course, legislators and administrative organizations that cost money and Canada is at ready overgoverned.

But while a separate province in Northern Ontario may be impractical, the occasional demand for it indicates a real need for a better understanding of the problems of a great domain. — Saint Ste. Marie Star.

If your small daughter is taught the elements of beauty now, she will acquire basic training invaluable later. This does not mean that she should be presented with a dressing table overlaid with sophisticated cosmetics. But she can learn, just as usually as she learns to wash her face, not only fundamental routines, but also the beauty precautions that prevent blemishes from appearing.

A thorough brushing of the hair each day is simple, yet the most important method of maintaining the natural glossiness and vigor of the hair. There is really no good reason why little darning should not brush her own hair, instead of having mother do it.

Mother will have to guard against excessive sunbath at the beach. Young, tender skins are very susceptible to the dangerous actinic rays that harden the skin and produce blemishes.

Little girls is a juvenile evil that a mother should suppress. It makes the cuticle tough and hard, spoils the shape of the fingers, and besides, is an unlovely habit. Occasional manicures will develop daughter's pride in the appearance of her hands. While on the subject of nails, a good thought should be given to toenails—careful trimming avoids painful ingrowths.

Canada Does Not Encourage Women To Be Aviators

Only Forty-nine Feminine Flyers in The Dominion Have Pilot's Certificates

OTTAWA. — One woman in the Dominion has a commercial flying license and 48 others have private pilot's certificates, but none is expected to apply for the new public transport pilot's certificates now being issued by the Department of National Defence and the highest grade of pilot's license now obtainable in Canada.

The dearth of women aviators is not due so much to lack of interest as to lack of encouragement by aviation authorities who realize that women fliers take up flying purely and simply as a sport while many men take it up as a profession. No woman in Canada has yet "made money" out of flying and though seven commercial licenses have been granted to women in the past they were sought as a proof of skill rather than for practical reasons.

The \$100 subsidy granted aviation clubs and schools for each man between the ages of 19 and 45 they teach to fly is not given in the case of women. Authorities state they see no reason for subsidizing women to become aviators as they would not be of any great use to the country's defence.

Give Your Eyes Occasional Bath

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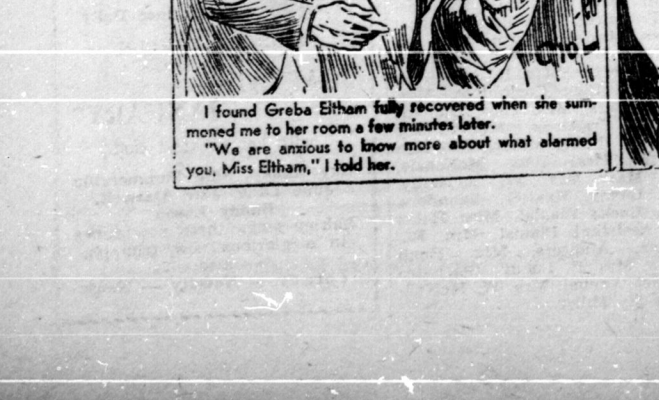

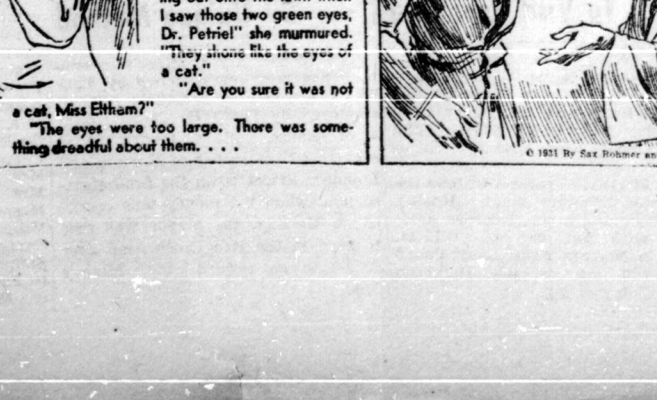
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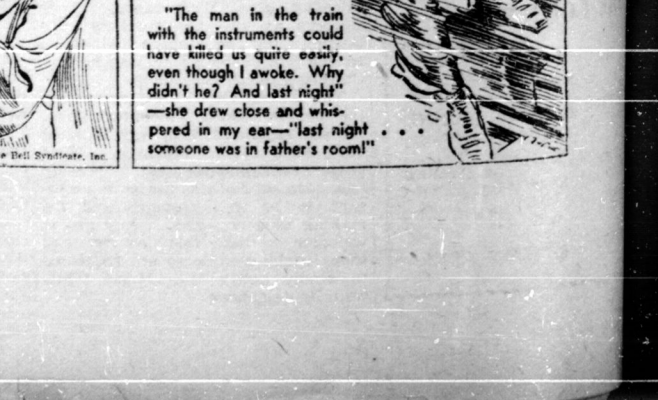
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
