The SNAPSHOT GUILD

IT'S ALL A MATTER OF HOW MUCH LIGHT

For nearby subjects when the light is not very bright as in the picture above, use a wide lens opening.

But for distant scenes, like this one, the very narrow use a small lens opening.

Modern cameras and modern film make it possible for you to achieve happy results with very little knowledge of your camera. The new snapshot film is so easy to use that you can get better pictures if you know enough about our cameras to understand the letter 'A'.

Any camera is simply a light-tight box or chamber, with a film at one end and a lens at the other. The lens is a transparent material that allows light to enter the camera. The film is a sensitive material that records the light that enters the camera.

The size of the lens and the extent to which it is opened are important. When the lens is opened to a large extent, more light enters the camera, and the picture is brighter. When the lens is opened to a small extent, less light enters the camera, and the picture is darker.
