Spray the nose on alternate days for
four days and then once a week
thereafter till the end of October.

2. To Children Who Have Been
Exposed—Parents whole blood is
advocated. This procedure immunizze your child from two to four
weeks. The blood of the parent is
injected into the child's buttocks.

3. To Children Who Have the
Disease—Serum—This is almost
109 per cent. if your physician diagnosis the case before paralysis sets

To permit the erection of fire-traps, to fail to provide an abundant and reliable water supply and means of using it or to fail to apply the everyday rules of fire prevention, is to constantly face a

nenace of heavy fires and sweeping conflagrations. Why tolerate a condition which not only levies tribute upon life and property but in effect imposes an added cost to the conduct of every feature of ousiness activity and increases the burden of the people in providing the necessitaties of life.

We cannot afford to go on and be indifferent to it all. Fire Prevention Week is a particular Week set aside to call attention to the menace of fire. Are you doing your part?

Open fire-places need to be well screened, and matches ought always to be kept in metal containers. A chemical fire extinguisher should be in a convenient place in every home. Do not leave young children alone in the home. The use of metal or firenroof roofing prevents fire from snarks on the roof. As a safe-cuard from lightning, buildings should be properly rodded by an agent holding a Fire Marshal license. The majority of fires late in summer or early fall are due to spontaneous combustion. A farmer cannot be too careful in curing and drying his crops before storing them in the herr. Twenty pounds of salt to a load of hay is recommended for safety. CAPITOL
