A brief debate on naval matters

A brief debate on naval matters failed to get the attention across the country which, to my mind, it merited, although one remark essentially in the nature of an aside, made by Premier Mackenzie King, was given prominence—the forecast that expeditionary forces either from the Dominions or Britain would probably not again fight in Europe. But reading between the lines of the debate which preceded this remark, one got the impression, especially if one had been in close touch with inside matters on Parliament Hill, that we have by no means heard the last of Canadian naval programs. The government had two or three other important programs which it might have proceeded with, if the Coronation had not stood in the way. Perhaps most far-reaching was a low cost housing scheme. It might be held that such a measure should not be introduced until the constitutional difficulties have been cleared up. Just the same I fancy that if there had been no movement for early prorogation, we should have had a measure of this kind at least introduced and studied this spring.

Control Armament Traffic

One last-minute amendment of major significance, however, is the change in the Customs Act whereby the government takes the power to license, regulate, prohibit if desired, the whole traffic in war armaments and supplies, whether it be import, manufacture, coastwise trade or domestic trade. This is the answer to those who demanded that the profit should be taken out of the munitions of war. The idea was most strongly suggested by members of the C.C.F. group. It will not be the first time that pioneer proposals hatched in the south-east' corner of the Chamber have been seized upon by the government of the day with considerable satisfaction.
