

## Heenan to Represent Ontario at Coronation

It has been officially announced that Hon. Peter Heenan will represent Ontario, the eastern Province of the Dominion of Canada at the Coronation ceremonies in England on May 2.

Regret has been expressed from some quarters that the late Premier Heenan is officially substituting the minister of Lands and Forestry, representing Ontario at the coronation. An editorial appearing in the St. Thomas Times-Journal said in part: "It is a matter of loyalty and devotion to the Crown with which we have no quarrel, but it is a matter of our Province. Can we be blamed if we feel that we should be represented at the greatest historical event of our time by our highest official?"

Dr. Herbert A. Bruce, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province, will also attend the coronation in his official capacity.
