

The ground should be allowed to settle after digging or plowing, and then levelled again. If there is time it is advisable to repeat this process several times. The top soil should then be raked fine and the grass sown at a liberal rate, once across and cace lengthwise. This double sowing insures an even distribution. For obvious reasons seed trivial. Seed, after all, is the cheapest thing about gardening and one of the few factors over which the gardener has absolute control. On these counts alone, it is highly important that only the best seed from reliable Canadian sources should be used. Everything else is wasted; soil; fertilizer and labor if foundation seed is not right. Surgeon Sees Hope For Cancer Victims WASHINGTON.—Research work is bringing more complete understanding of the cause of cancer and development of more effective methods of treatment, Surgeon General Thomas Parran of the Public Health Service said this week.

"I think we may be on the eve of important developments in getting at the factors which cause cancer and thereby eliminating them," he said.

That belief, he added, is inspired not by the discovery of methods preventing cancer but, paradoxically, because many chemical substances have been found which produce cancer.


